Learn To Be A Good Shepherd Through John 10:11-18

We all love the image of the Good Shepherd, and the common image is Jesus carrying a sheep around his shoulder. This image reflects tender care and love. Some of us may also wish to be, like Jesus, a good shepherd.

You do not have to wish to be a good shepherd because you are already a good shepherd. Every parent loves their children. The difference between us and Jesus is the level of love. Jesus loves his sheep. He knows each of them by name. He knows how stinky his sheep are, but he accepts the smell of his sheep.

What about us? Do we love our children? The answer is yes. However, do we accept the smell of our children? This is a big question, isn't it?

I believe we have to go back to the fundamental definition of love. Love does not mean that we give whatever our children want. Love means to give everything that our children need.

There are three basic needs of life: food, water, and shelter. However, there are needs beyond the physical existence. Children need to learn charity from their parents. Children need to learn a good solid foundation of a family life, which is the commitment of their parents to the family; where truthfulness and faithfulness reveal between husband and

wife, and the commitment and involvement that their parents have for their faith community. Furthermore, the family should be a place where communication is accessible. Communication is the number one factor that keeps a family together. Communication creates an environment of trust. Parents, have you taught your children these things through your daily life or you just talk at them? Parents, have you spent time with your flock and gotten to know them?

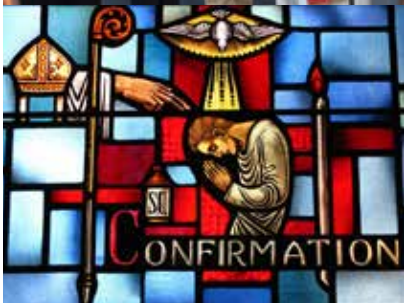

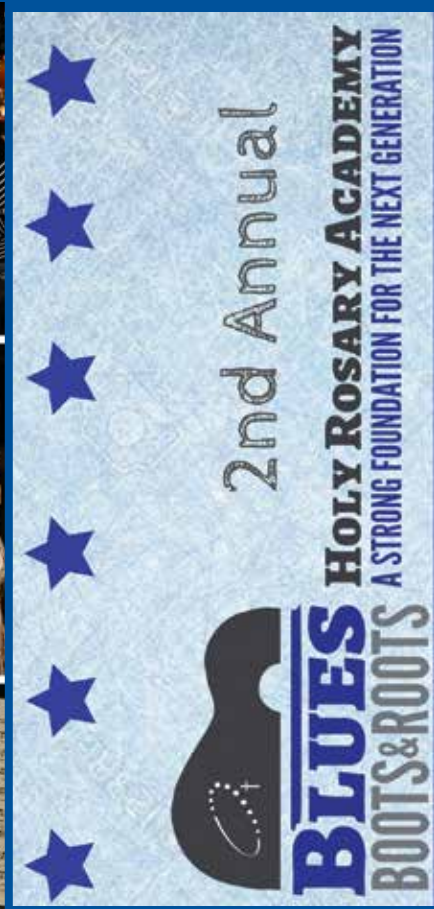

- Chrissa Jennings reminded all that the Dining Hall must be cleaned thoroughly after use. Tables, floors must be clean, chairs put up and tables set as per the grid. Copies of rules will be sent via email. Also, not that facility requests must be filed before any events or meetings, even use of the church foyer after the masses. Obtain forms from Chrissa for approval.
- Carolyn Berry presented the 2018 – 2019 Academy Budget which was approved by the Finance Committee. After discussion the Parish Council unanimously voted to accept the Budget.

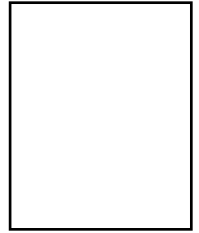
